

The Lindsay Municipal Swimming Pool hours are Tuesday through Saturday, 1 p.m. to 7 p.m. and Sunday, 1:30p.m. to 5:30 p.m. It will be closed on Monday. Apply Now For Absentee Ballots In Garvin County

who want to have absentee ballots mailed to them for the July 29 Primary election should apply now, County Election Board Secretary Brinley, said today. Although the County Election Board can accept applications for absentee ballots until 5 p.m. on Wednesday, July 23, Brinley urged voters who want to vote by absentee ballot to apply early.

Absentee ballot application forms are available at the County Election Board office located at the Garvin County Courthouse, First Floor, Room 8. The absentee ballot application forms also can be downloaded and printed from the Internet at www.elections. state.ok.us.

"At least two mail transactions must be made," Brinley said. "The County Election Board must mail the ballots to the voter and the voter must return the voted ballots by mail." Ballots must be in the hands of the County Election Board by 7 p.m. on

counted.

Brinley said that any registered voter may vote by absentee ballot in any election in which he or she is eligible to vote. It is not necessary to give a reason---or excuse---for voting absentee. "While anyone can vote absentee without giving a reason, the law still provides several excuses, and it is to the advantage of some voters to use one of them," Brinley said. By stating one of the following reasons on their applications, these voters can activate some special conditions that make it easier for them to use absentee

ballots. The reasons are: -- Voters who are physically incapacitated and voters who care for physically incapacitated persons who cannot be left unattended may vote absentee. They may apply only by mail, by fax, or by telegraph.

-- Voters who are confined to nursing homes in the county may vote absentee.

Voters in Garvin County Election Day in order to be An Absentee Voting Board actually goes to the nursing home a few days before the election, sets up a small polling place and allows these persons to vote under circumstances similar to those at a regular precinct polling place. They may apply only

by mail or by fax .-- Military personnel and residents of the county living overseas and the spouses and dependents of each group are eligible to vote absentee without being registered. These voters may apply only by mail or by fax. Military personnel should contact the Voting Service Officers in their units for application forms and additional information. Residents of Oklahoma living overseas can obtain the same materials from any United States military installation and from United States Embassies and Consulates. Military personnel and overseas citizens also can download and print the appropriate application form from the Internet at www.fvap.gov.

Matchbook Memories

TIMES THEY ARE A'CHANGIN'

Last week, my friend, L.B. Hoyle, sent me an article entitled "That's Only 53 Years Ago." The article was a collection of comments made in the year 1955. Several of the items started me to thinking. I witnessed these things, and I might very well have made similar comments. The list of comments may set you to thinking too.

1. "When I first started driving, who would have thought gas would someday cost 29 cents a gallon. Guess we'd be better off leaving the car in the garage." In August, 1967, as I was preparing to drive from Greeley, Colorado, to Weatherford to join the faculty of Southwestern, I stopped for gas. I was shocked to see that the price of gasoline had gone up to 35 cents per gallon. My tank held nearly \$6.00 worth of gas. Now \$6.00 would not buy two gallons. When I filled my car today, I paid \$3.89 per gallon. This week, I paid more than \$7.00 to fill my two-gallon lawn mower gas can. Now I cannot imagine ever paying 35 cents a gallon for gas.

2. "Have you seen the new cars coming out next year? It won't be long before \$2,000 will only buy a used one." Only a few kinds of new cars now cost less than \$20,000. Many pickups cost more than \$40,000. I bought my first car in 1955. It was a very good 1950 Chevrolet, bought new by Virgil Hamilton, a Bradley farmer. I wrote a check for \$650 to pay for that car. I drove it until I graduated from college in 1957. I still have the canceled check I wrote to pay for my first car.

3. "Did you hear the post office is thinking about charging a dime just to mail a letter?" People of my age understand this complaint. I remember three cent stamps for letters and penny post cards. This week, I bought a sheet of fortytwo cent "forever" stamps, which promise they will send a letter no matter how much the price of stamps increases. In my boyhood, you

could send fourteen letters for the price of one letter today.

4. "If they think I'll pay 50 cents for a haircut, forget it." When I was a child, my father cut my hair. I paid 35 cents for the first barber shop haircut that I can remember. In the late 1930s at Enoch Pamplin's barber shop in Bradley, a haircut cost 10 cents. An older Bradley man once told me about a haircut price war in Bradley where the two barbers charged 5 cents for a haircut. Now I gladly pay my barber \$10.00 for a haircut, and, as a bonus, I get free hunting and fishing stories for the duration of the haircut.

5. "If cigarettes keep going up in price, I'm going to quit. A quarter a pack is ridiculous." Once upon a time long ago, I smoked. I recall when Winston cigarettes went up from 25 cents to 35 cents a pack. I thought I was ruined. For a while, I even dipped Copenhagen, for which I paid 25 cents a box. This week I overheard an older man about my age discussing the purchase of a sixbox package of Wintergreen snuff. He explained that for \$6.00 you got a bonus box in the six-roll package. I am glad I quit all tobacco in 1956.

6. "It's too bad things are so tough nowadays. I see where a few married women are having to work to make ends meet." I know only a few women who do not work outside the home unless they work on the family farm or in the family business. The entire family structure has changed in the past fifty years. I even know some "house husbands" who stay at Pickens has challenged donors home and keep the house and care for the kids while their wives work.

When I read the list that L.B. sent me, I wondered what such a Regents for Higher Education list would include fifty years from now. I am sure the list would include surprises just as this one did. Our

McClain County Extension Seeks To **Receive Matching Funds From OSRHE**

McClain County OSU Cooperative Extension has been challenged with the monumental task of raising \$250,000 before June 30, 2008.

Oklahoma State University alumnus T. Boone to join him in taking part in receiving matching funds from the Oklahoma State (OSRHE). With a donation of \$250,000, Pickens will match those funds and then the OSRHE will qualify the dollar match. Together the initial donation will result in

a \$1 million endowed faculty chair. This endowed chair can be designated to benefit the McClain County Extension

With the announcement the state is changing the endowed chair matching program on July 1, residents can take full advantage of the current dollar-for-dollar state match to add significant support to OSU and the Cooperative Extension Service with their donations through the end of the month.

A \$1 million endowment will generate about \$45,000 of operating funds each year. Forty-five thousand dollars of operating funds can be used for such things as purchase of educational materials, costs of putting on a conference or workshop, scholarships, hiring support personnel part-time or perhaps even full-time personnel.

The McClain County 4-H program would see immediate benefits from this endowment. Currently the 4-H Extension Educator and County Program Assistant positions are funded by a county sales tax that is renewed every five years by county voters. With this endowment we can guarantee that McClain County will always have a 4-H Program Educator.

During 2007 McClain

County Extension programming reached 2,194 youth within the county through 4-H and school enrichment programs. Nine senior 4-H'ers reported being involved in 367 different projects and spending 1,731 hours performing community service activities. During those community service activities more than 5,474 individuals were helped in some way.







High Plains Range Camp To Be Held

Highschool students looking for a week-long camp to attend this summer are encouraged to consider the High Plains Range Camp, where being outside is "in." Held June 16-20, 2008 at Camp Billy Joe in Kenton, Oklahoma, Range Camp gives students the opportunity to learn about natural resources and the environment in a ranch setting.

The camp is set in beautiful country, featuring terrain and vegetation from the Rocky Mountains and the High Plains. The vegetation is very diverse and provides excellent education opportunities amongst the rocks, canyons, creeks and mesas of the area.

A major focus of the camp is to teach youth the importance of range management through the use of evaluation skills and land management planning. The majority of the activities during camp are outdoor related, beginning with plant identification, soils, ecological site descriptions and GIS mapping. Campers will be taught how to evaluate habitat for livestock and wildlife, as well as how to develop a land management plan. Campers will hike, play games and have fun while learning team building and leadership skills. Field trips are planned to historical sites and working ranches. Evenings are filled with cultural events such as chuck wagon dinners and campfire cookouts.

High Plains Range Camp is open to high school sophomores,

juniors and seniors from Texas, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Kansas and Colorado. Ten students will be accepted from each state. Registration is \$150, which includes meals, lodging and transportation during the camp. Camp check-in begins at 1 p.m. on Monday, June 16, and ends with an awards presentation at noon on Friday, June 20.

Instruction is provided by natural resource specialists from the USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service, Universities, Extension, conservation districts, educators, ranchers and others from the five-state area.
