After a Frederick fumble Lindsay would go ahead with just 70 seconds left in the game on Scott Hacker's 8 yard run. Josiah Harrison would convert the extra point and the Leopards would lead Frederick by 1 touchdown. On the ensuing kick off, the Leopards would recover a Bomber fumble and run out the clock to seal the victory.

Matchbook **Memories**

TIMES CHANGES EVERYTHING **PART I**

Days seemed longer then when we lived on the Victria farm during World War II. The days seemed to last forever. From the time we got up before daylight in the morning until we went to bed not long after dark, the days seemed to creep along. There seemed to be time to do everything we needed to do without the sense of urgency that plagues our days now. In the minds of us who lived in those long ago days, we are startled by the changes that we have witnessed. As the title of a Bob Wills song suggests, time changes everything.

Even in retirement, my days are never long enough. I answer my alarm each morning at 6 a.m. We woke up on the farm at 6 a.m. or earlier, not because of an alarm clock, but in response to my father's innate sense of what time to awake. We never owned an alarm clock. but my father never failed to awaken on time. Then he called us once, and we were expected to hit the cold winter floor at once.

We began the day quickly and simply. It took only seconds to put on a plain blue or khaki shirt and a pair of overalls. We did not have to choose which pair of shoes to wear. We had only one pair. A quick trip to the wash bench in the kitchen to rinse our hands in the wash pan, splash water on our faces, and dry our hands and faces on the family towel, and we were ready for breakfast. There was no waiting in line for our turn to the bathroom. We didn't have one.

My mother would have awakened before anyone else. She would have breakfast on the table when we came into the kitchen. Everyone ate at once. There was no eating in shifts as we do today. And there were no special orders. On the table, there would be a large platter of fried eggs, another large platter of ham, bacon, or, on a special morning, fried squirrel, a pan of hot biscuits made from scratch, homemade butter, homemade jelly, and cups of steaming hot coffee for everyone, even a ten-year-old boy. Generally we would be in and out of the kitchen within thirty minutes, leaving a long morning ahead before we came back for dinner at noon.

Now, early mornings seem to fly by. From the time I get up at 6 a.m.until I leave the house for coffee at The Mark Restaurant, more than an hour passes. First, I let my small golden dog out, check the computer for e-mail, scan The New York Times on the web, and check the Boydston Funeral Home obituaries. Then I start a pot of coffee before I turn on the television to watch the end of the KWTV local news before switching to KFOR to watch the first segment of "The Today Show" while I have two cups of coffee.

By then, my wife has toast and oatmeal ready. After I have eaten, it is time to shave and dress. By now, an hour and a half has passed, and I am just leaving the house for coffee at The Mark. After three or four cups of The Mark coffee and interesting talk with my friends there, I buy a paper to read at home or at my office. The clock reads 9 a.m. as I begin whatever I plan to do for the rest of the morning. On the farm, we would have been working for over two hours. And there would still be three hours before we could eat dinner.

The days seemed longer on the farm in those years because our lives were less cluttered. We lived simply because there was no other way. In the morning, we would have time to milk the cows, slop the hogs, feed the mules and horses, separate the milk, and still do the main work of the morning such as plant the crops, chop cotton, cut broomcorn, pull cotton, or gather corn, whatever the season called for. We had time to focus on the task at hand. Now our fragmented lives have us running in all directions, accomplishing less work and feeling

Additionally as a service project counties collected more than 1400 pounds of aluminum pull tabs for the Ronald McDonald House.
